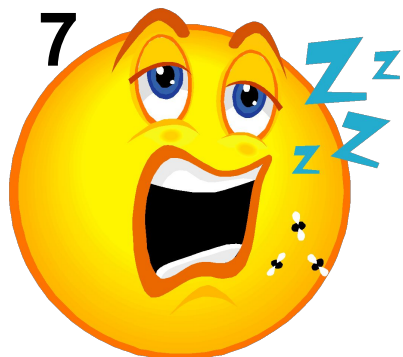
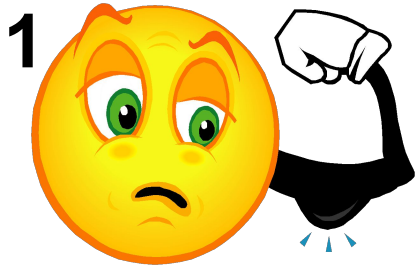
# *Boring or Bored?*
