# FUTURE CONTINUES IN USE

The future continuous tense isn't taught very much in English classes but, in fact, English speakers use it a lot. You will sound much more natural if you master this tense.



- We mainly use the **Future Continuous** to indicate that we will be in the middle of doing something in a specified time in the future. There are also two other uses, listed below:
- **Use**
- Future actions in progress
- Guesses about the present or the future
- Polite questions about somebody's intention

# Future Continuous

**will be + V-ing**

<i>Положительная форма</i>	<i>Отрицательная форма</i>	<i>Вопросительная форма</i>
<p>I will be going</p> <p>YOU</p> <p>WE will be going</p> <p>THEY</p> <p>HE</p> <p>SHE will be going</p> <p>IT</p>	<p>I will <b>NOT</b> be going</p> <p>YOU</p> <p>WE will <b>NOT</b> be going</p> <p>THEY</p> <p>HE</p> <p>SHE will <b>NOT</b> be going</p> <p>IT</p>	<p>Will I be going ?</p> <p>YOU</p> <p>Will WE be going ?</p> <p>THEY</p> <p>HE</p> <p>Will SHE be going ?</p> <p>IT</p>

In the same way as with the future simple, usually we use the short form ('ll be verb-ing) when we are speaking.

As with the positive, we usually use the short form (won't + be + verb-ing) when speaking.





## EXAMPLES:

- Affirmative: He'll be going to the local polyclinic at 9 o'clock tomorrow.
- Negative: He won't be going to the local polyclinic at 9 o'clock tomorrow.
- Interrogative: Will he be going to the local polyclinic at 9 o'clock tomorrow?



## EXAMPLES:

- Affirmative: I'll be having warm applications at 2 o'clock tomorrow.
- Negative: I won't be having warm applications at 2 o'clock tomorrow.
- Interrogative: Will I be having warm applications at 2 o'clock tomorrow?



## EXAMPLES:

- Affirmative: The physician will be making the diagnosis to my mother at 5 o'clock tomorrow.
- Negative: Will the physician be making the diagnosis to my mother at 5 o'clock tomorrow?
- Interrogative: The physician won't be making the diagnosis to my mother at 5 o'clock tomorrow.





## EXAMPLES:

- Affirmative: His temperature will be falling, I expect.
- Negative: His temperature won't be falling, I expect.
- Interrogative: Will his temperature be falling, won't it?
