- Kazan is a city with ancient traditions, including traditions in the field of wedding dresses. By the opening of the Universiade in Kazan a new registry office was built. The new city registry office resembles a bowl or a copper Tatar cauldron (cauldron). The bowl is decorated with a metal bas-relief with winged leopards and dragons Zilant. The project of the building was created according to the design of the sculptor Namdakov.



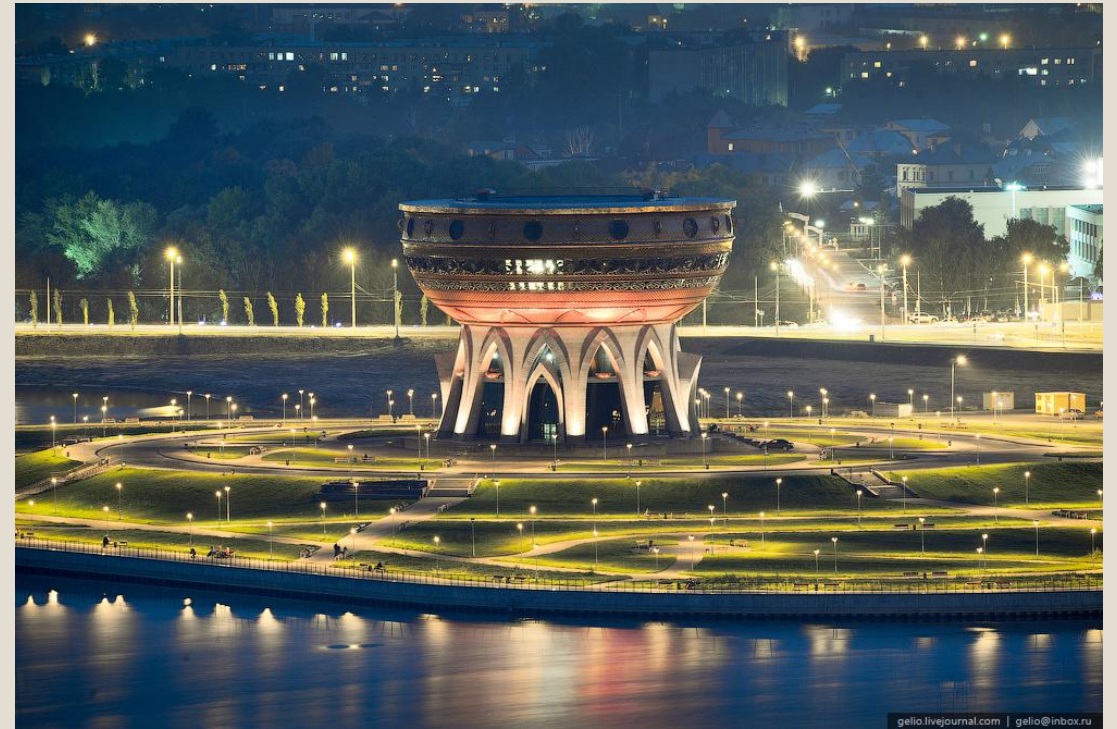
- Kazan Registry Office was opened on July 5, 2013. On this day it registered a marriage of 27 couples in honor of the twenty-seventh Universiade. There are three wedding halls in the building.
- Location: Sibgata Hakima St., 4, Russia, Republic of Tatarstan, Kazan



- According to legend, the name of the city of Kazan came from the word "kazan" - a cauldron. Copper cauldron symbolizes abundance and fertility. This is the wish that is addressed to all the newlyweds who decided to marry in the new registry office.



- The cup of Kazan registry office is crowned with an open viewing platform, located at the altitude of 32 meters. You can climb the platform only by the stairs (32 meters - it has 8 floors). From the viewing platform you can have a breathtaking view of the ancient and eternally young Kazan.



- The Registry office is visible from a far, walkways are laid to it, and parking for cars is organized. The observation platform on the bowl of the REGISTRY OFFICE is a great place for photo sessions.
- Also, everyone can see the metric books with a record of the marriage of famous people.



- Price: registration of the marriage is free of charge, it is enough only to pay the state fee. If you want to order music or photographer services, you will need to discuss this issue in advance. From sources of word-of-mouth radio, we learned that local musicians will sing and play for you for 1000 rubles, and to capture the touching moments of your life for memory is 1500 rubles.
