• According to the legend, the one who travels by Bregagd Road near the town of Ballycastle in Northern Ireland and passes through this tunnel can see the ghost of the "Lady Grey" wandering in the shadows. The grove was planted by the Stuart family over 300 years ago. Perhaps this is the most photographed road in Ireland.







Giant Elephant Appears to Emerge from a Cliff Face in Iceland

• A natural rock formation off the coast of Iceland looks very much like an elephant with its trunk dipped in the Atlantic. What makes it so 'real' is also that the cliff is mostly formed from basalt rock which look like the wrinkled elephant skin.

Fireflies Cave offers visitors three different levels and starts at the top level caves and catacombs.
