

# SUDBURY VALLEY SCHOOL

STARTED 1968; FOR CHILDREN 4-19 YEARS OLD

THE TEACHERS BELIEVE THAT:

- ALL PEOPLE ARE CURIOUS AND CREATIVE.
- LEARNING MAKES SENSE ONLY WHEN LEARNERS DECIDE WHAT, WHEN AND HOW THEY WANT TO LEARN,
  - ONLY A FREE PERSON CAN BE RESPONSIBLE FOR HIS OR HER LIFE.

Interviewer: What's happening in the school right now? It's 10 a.m. but most children are not in their classrooms like in traditional schools. What are they doing?

Teacher: Well, some are playing basketball or riding their bikes.

Most of them love sport. Some are developing pictures in the photo lab. Others are talking about last weekend or discussing politics.

Some of them are studying traditional subjects, like biology or maths. In this way, they are learning how to work with other people and how to organise their learning.

Interviewer: Who runs the school?

Teacher: We all do. We meet once a week at the School Meeting and we make all the important decisions. Each student and each teacher has one vote.

Interviewer: Keira, what is life like at the school?

Student: Well, it's a challenge but I love it because I decide what I learn and who teaches me. Many students don't go to classes and they don't have traditional subjects. I think we learn most from conversations with other people. I read a lot and talk to other kids and the teachers and we do a lot of things together. We learn things when we need them. At the moment, we're reading a lot about the Middle Ages because we're preparing a play about the history, the clothes and the lifestyles of that time.

1st conditional

used for future real/factual situatins present simple If I study hard, will + base verb

I will pass my exams.

2nd conditional

used for present or future unreal, imaginary situations past simple
If I studied hard,

would + base verb
I would pass my exams.

3rd conditional

used for past unreal, imaginary situations past perfect

If I had studied hard,

would have + past participle
I would have passed my exams.
