WHAT IS TERRORISM?

- ❑ **Terrorism** is the systematic use of terror. Common definitions of terrorism refer only to those violent acts which are intended to create fear.

- ❑ -Civil disorder
- ❑ -Political terrorism
- ❑ -Non-Political terrorism
- ❑ -Quasi-terrorism
- ❑ -Limited political terrorism
- ❑ -Official or state terrorism

MOTIVATION OF TERRORISTS

- ❑ - To **intimidate** people from cooperating with the state
- ❑ - To **incite** counter-terrorism by the state to polarise the population
- ❑ - To **gain attention**



TACTICS

- ❑ - Secession of a territory to form a new sovereign state
- ❑ - Dominance of territory or resources
- ❑ - Imposition of a particular form of government
- ❑ - Economic deprivation of a population
- ❑ - Opposition to a domestic government
- ❑ - Religious fanaticism



HOW STATES RESPONSE TO TERRORISM?

- ❑ - Targeted laws, criminal procedures
- ❑ - Target hardening
- ❑ - Preemptive or reactive military action
- ❑ - Increased intelligence and surveillance activities
- ❑ - Preemptive humanitarian activities
- ❑ - More permissive interrogation and
- ❑ detention policies
