

Terrorism is the systematic use of terror. Common definitions of terrorism refer only to those violent acts which are intended to create fear.

- Political terrorism
- Non-Political terrorism
- -Quasi-terrorism
- -Limited political terrorism
- Official or state terrorism

- Imposition of a particular form of government
 - Economic deprivation of a population
 - Opposition to a domestic government
 - Religious fanaticism

- Increased intelligence and surveillance activities
- Preemptive humanitarian activities
- More permissive interrogation and detention policies
