Christmas symbols.


A symbolic form of a wreath, a circle with red ribbons, means the royal colour and the future resurrection of Christ.







Christmas Mass in Great Britain

Love Christmas!







Festive Xmas crackers are used to decorate the table.














The Birth of Christ

This day it was possible to eat only sochivo-boiled wheat with honey, varenniki or borsch.




But with the approach of the 7th of January ,on the table it was authorized to put meat.
