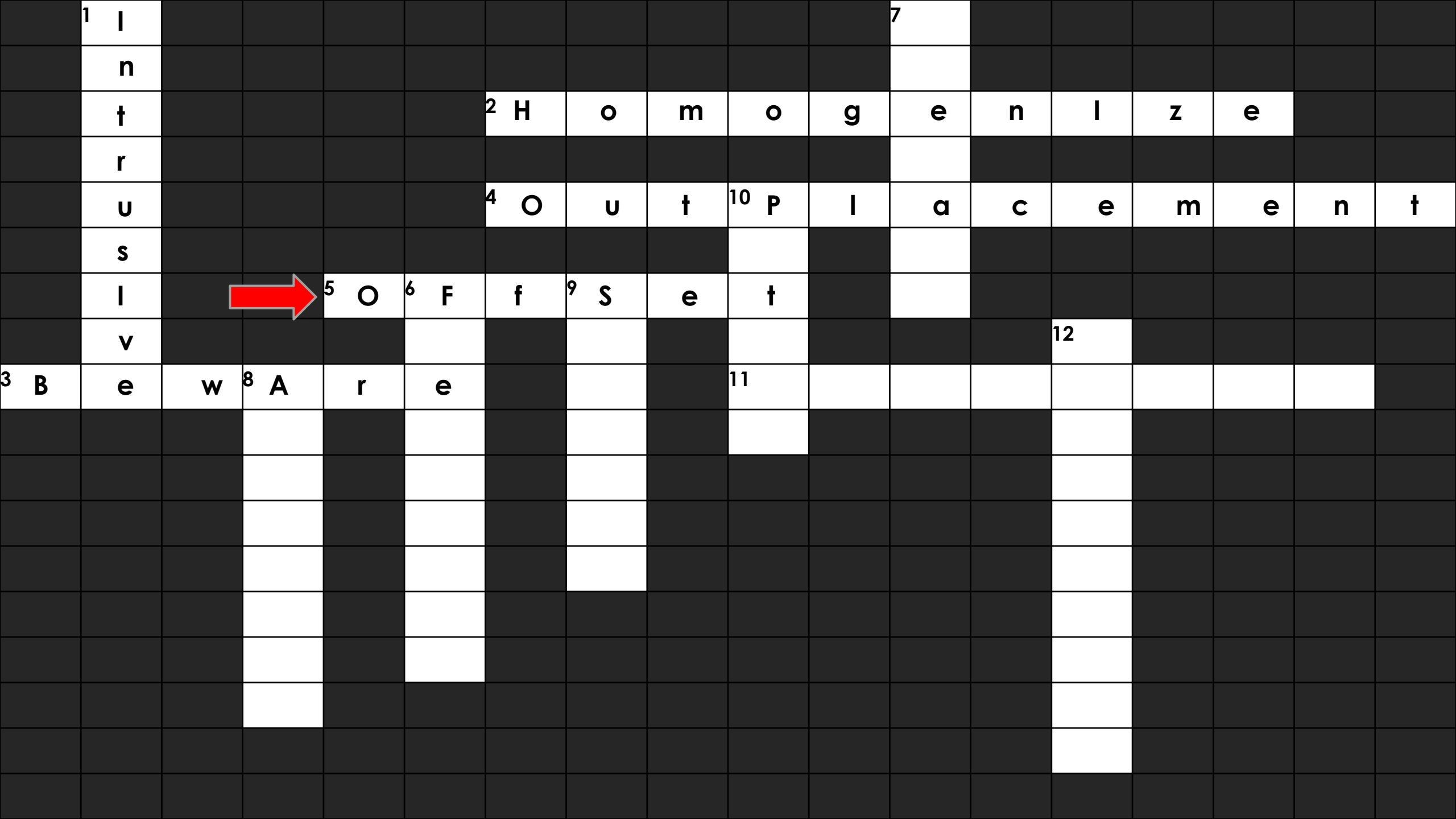
noun [count or uncount] the

redundant






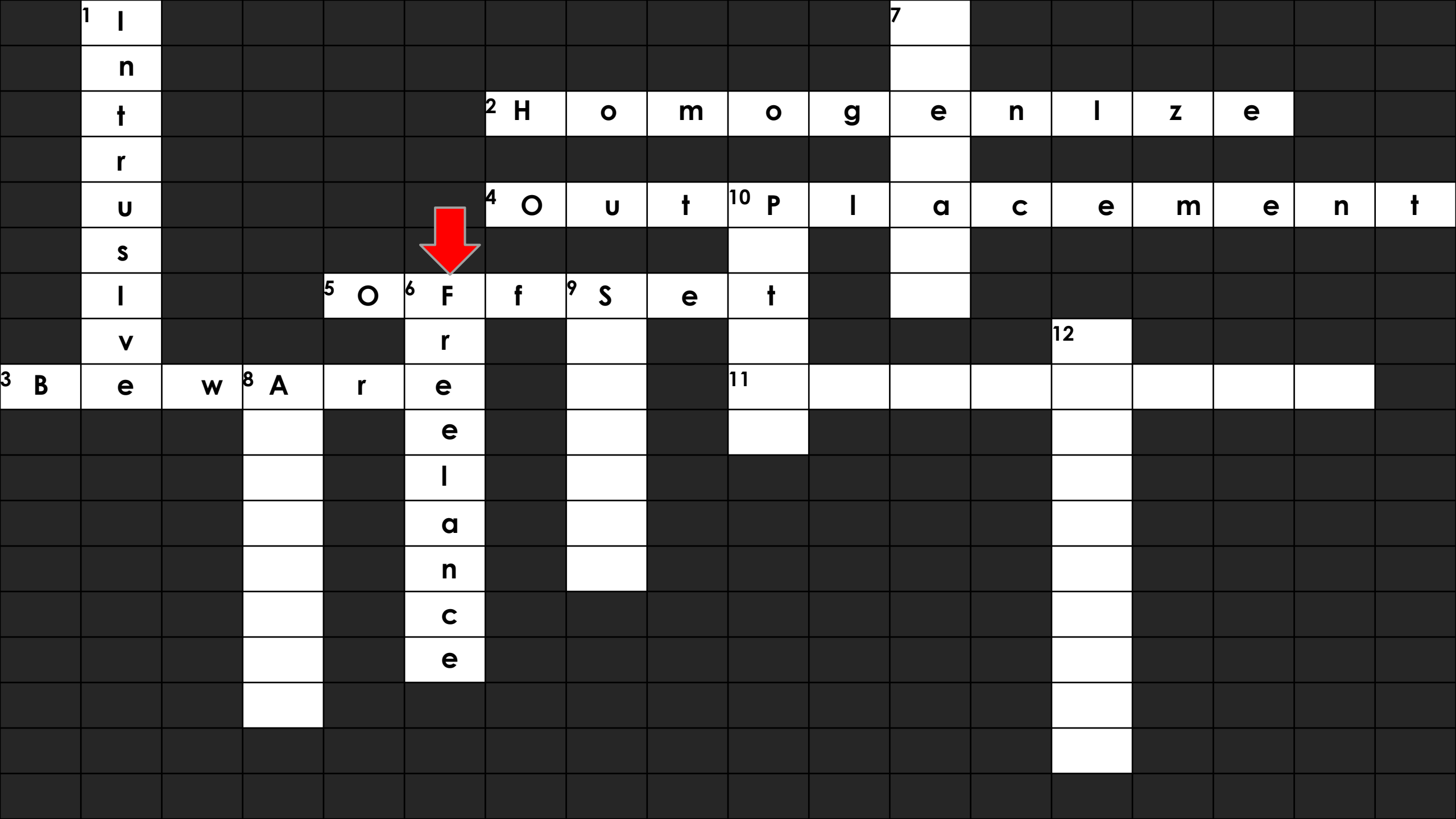


verb [transitive] to balance the

disadvantage



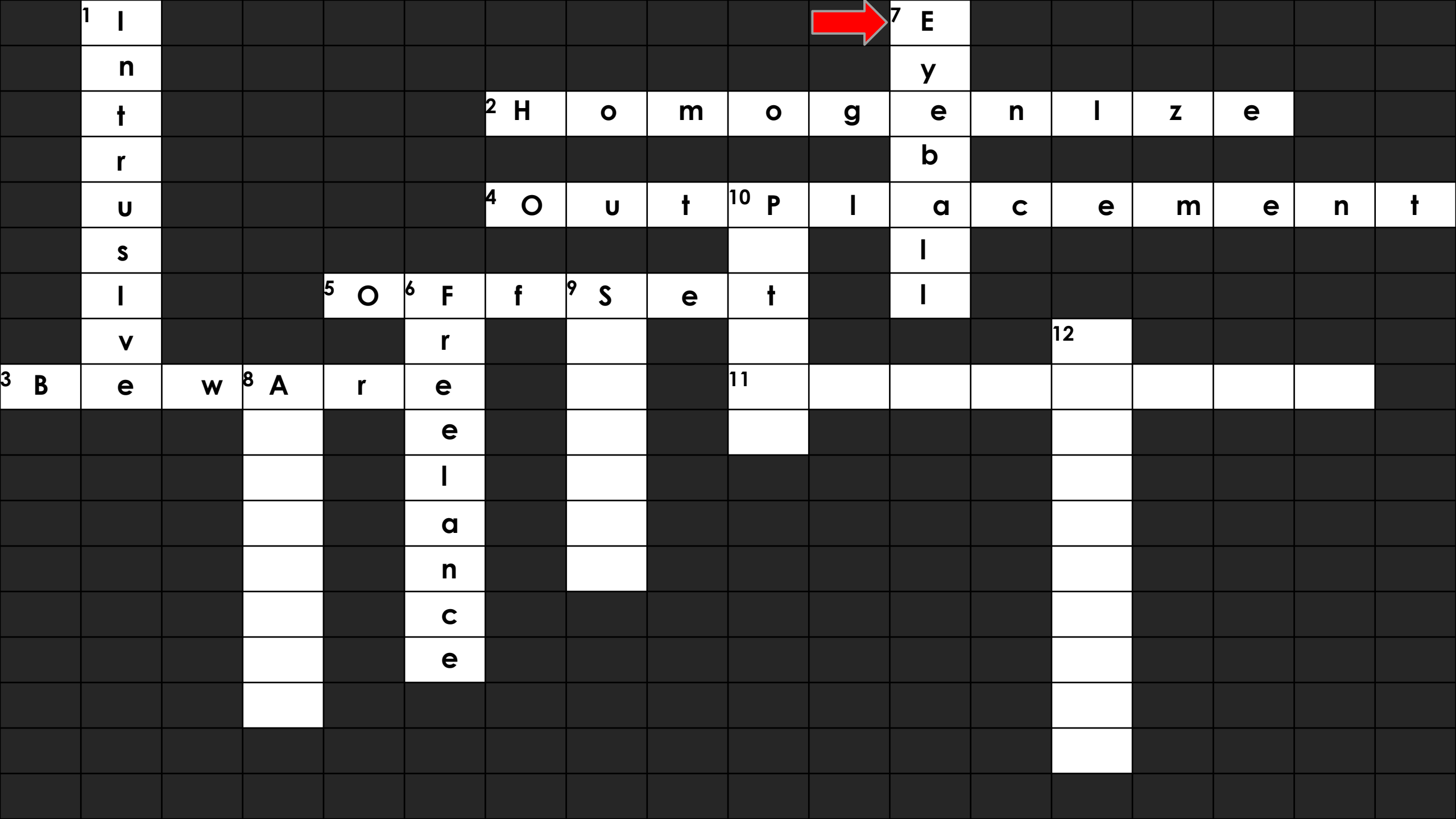



adjective freelance work is done

company





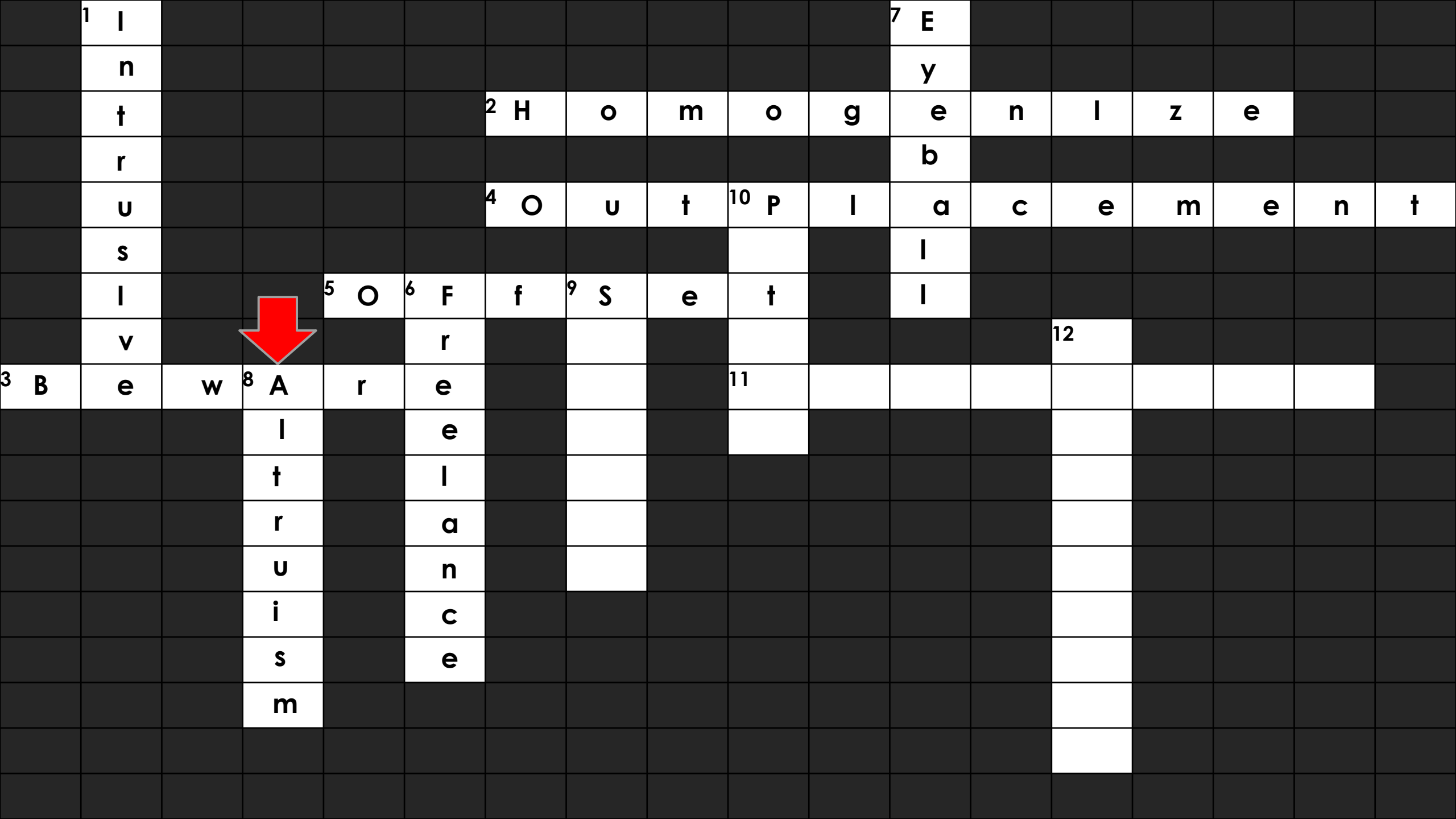
noun [count] the whole ball that

browsing a website






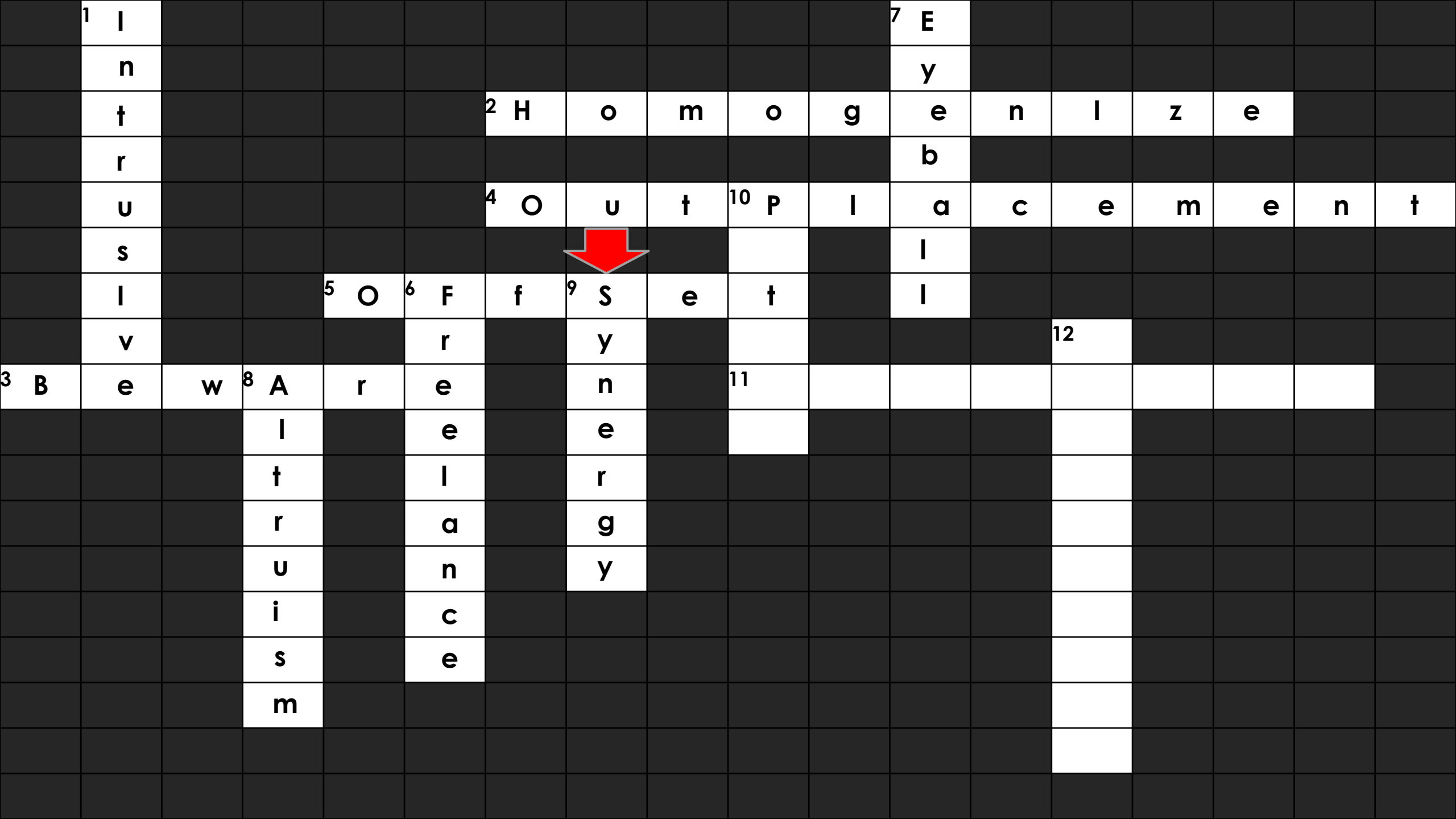
noun [uncount] a way of thinking

yourself








noun [count or uncount] BUSINESS

efforts



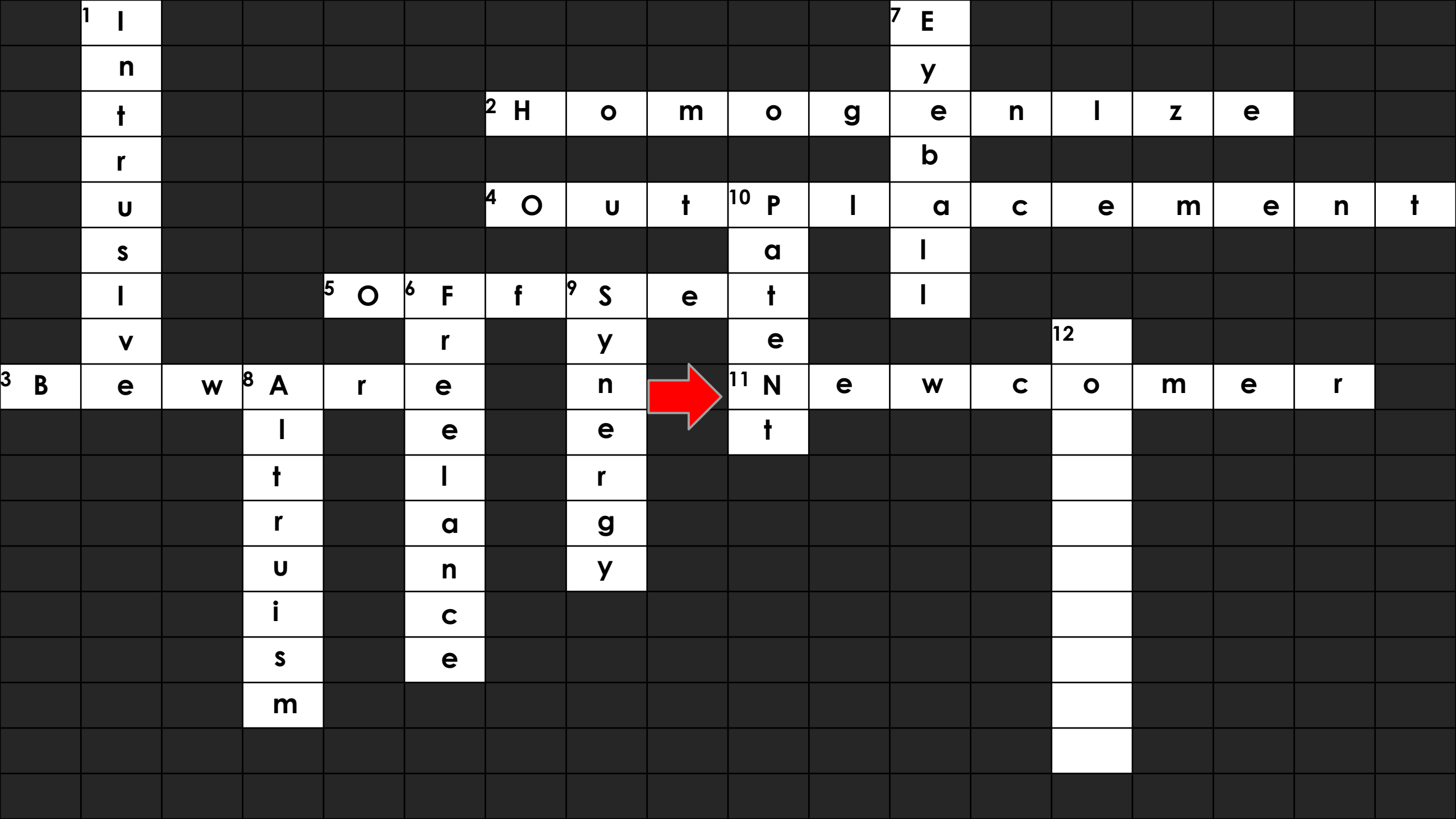


noun [count] an official document that gives someone who has invented something the legal right to make or sell that invention for a particular period of time, and prevents anyone else from doing so:



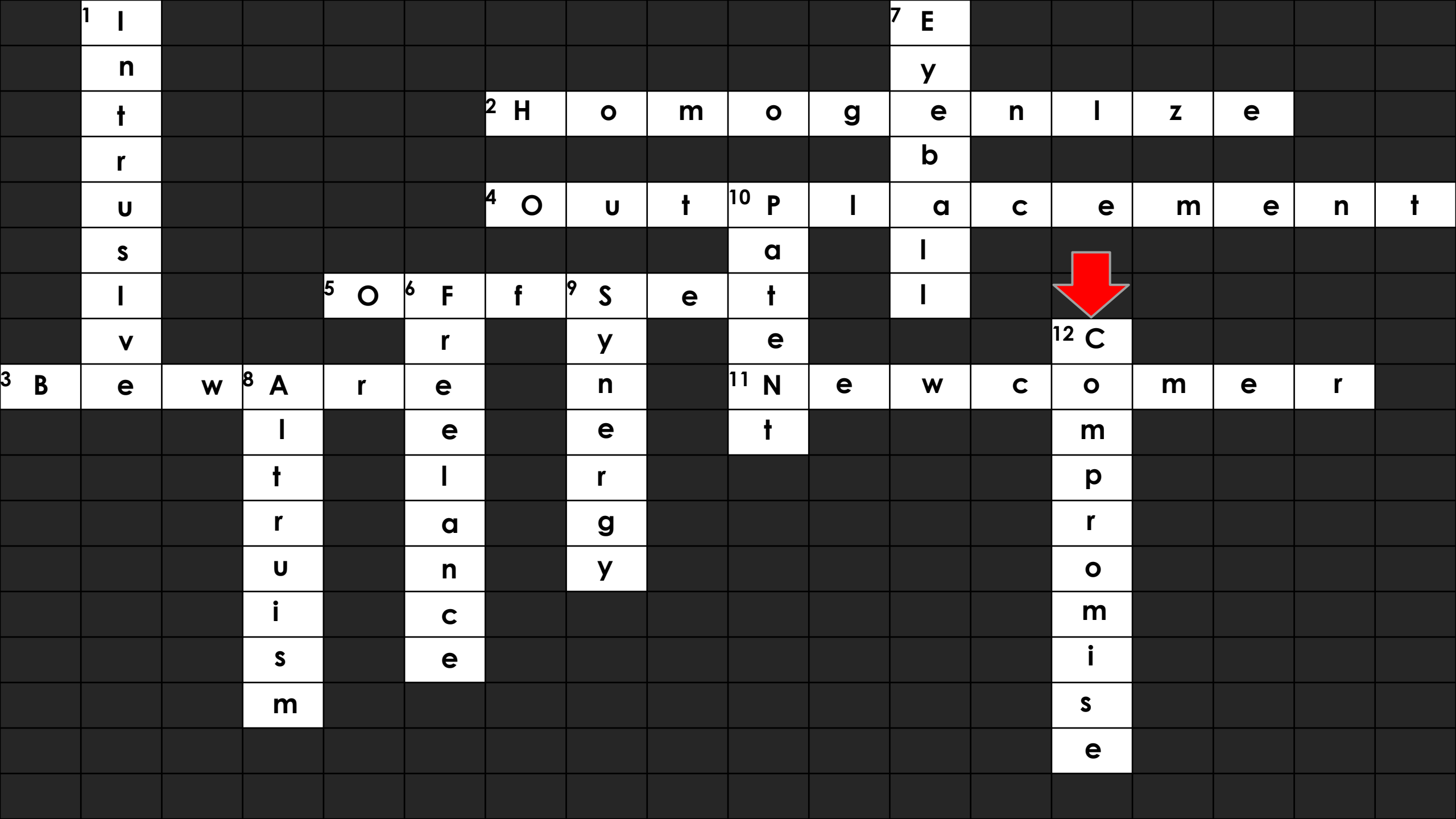


noun [count] a person or
