Buying or selling something at a very cheap price.




"Roy was selling his collection of toys very cheaply. They were going **for a song**!"

"Chase's boss told him not to 'Blow your own trumpet' after he succeeded at work."




"Daryl and John got together in the studio for a **jam session**. They were thinking up ideas for their new album."
