
The Universal Declaration of Human Rights

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights was adopted in 1948 by the UN's General Assembly.




Eleanor Roosevelt reads the Universal Declaration

The Declaration arose directly from the experience of the <u>Second World War</u> and represents the first global expression of rights to which all human beings are entitled.




It consists of 30 articles which have been elaborated in subsequent international treaties, regional <u>human rights</u> instruments, national constitutions and laws.

Article 1

 All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.



Article 2

• Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Furthermore, no distinction shall be made on the basis of the political, jurisdictional or international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs, whether it be independent, trust, non-self-governing or under any other limitation of sovereignty.
