



Indirect speech follows the rules of the Sequence of tenses. We change pronouns and adverbial modifiers according to the meaning and we use sequence of tenses. We don't use any punctuations.


HE SAYS: " I'LL BE THERE AT 10" HE TOLD THAT HE 'LD BE THERE AT 10

The complex sentence consists of the "main" clause and one or more "subordinate" clauses.













INDIRECT SPEECH IMPERATIVE SENTENCES

Put into Indirect speech by the verb **Tell smb/ ask smb** by infinitive "to"

He said:"<u>Press</u> the red button!"
▶ He told me to press the red button.

She said: "<u>Don't answer</u> the phone now!"
she asked me <u>not to answer</u> the phone then.

In indirect speech in negative sentences we use **"not"** before the infinitive **"to"**

He says: "don't smoke" He told me not to smoke. Teacher says:"don't look" Teacher told her not to look.
