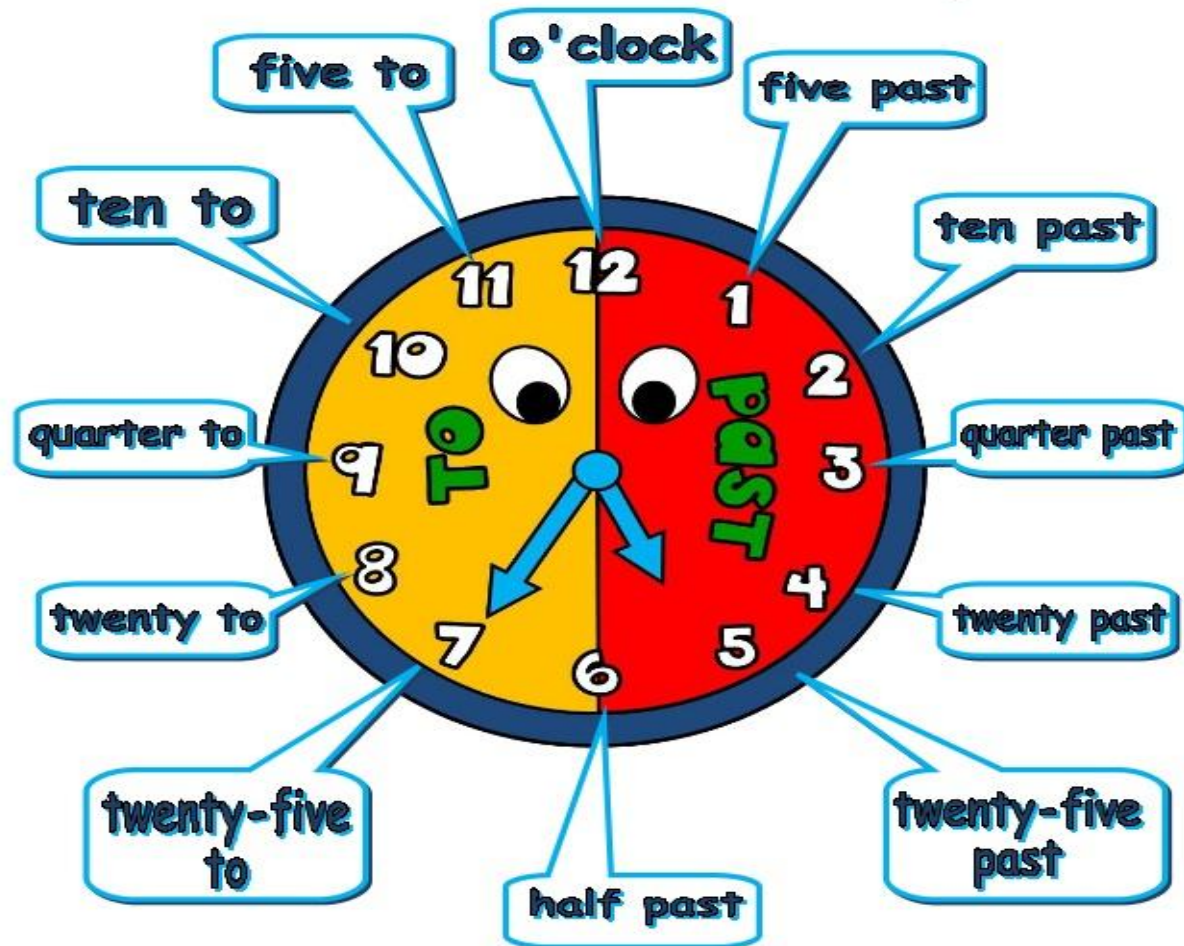

a.m. → Latin - ante meridiem = **before noon**

p.m. → Latin - post meridiem = **after noon**


SNOW


SNOWMAN


