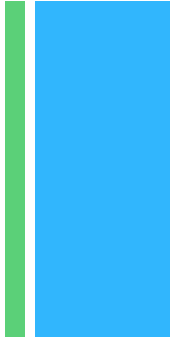

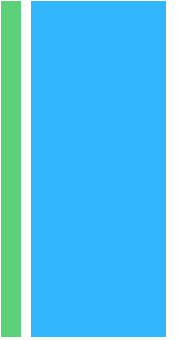
- Morgan's favorite food is spaghetti.

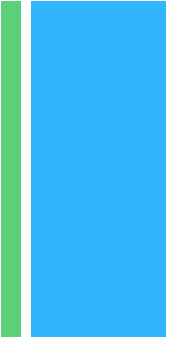

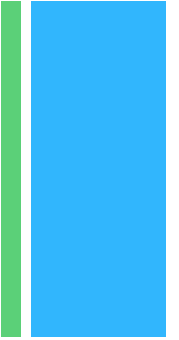

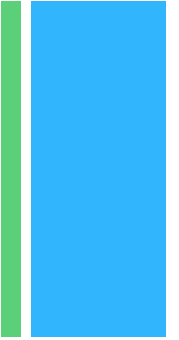

- Her sister is in 2nd grade.



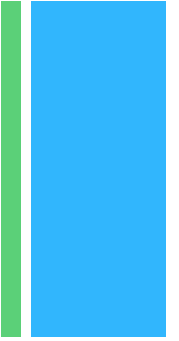

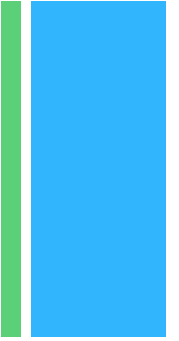
