

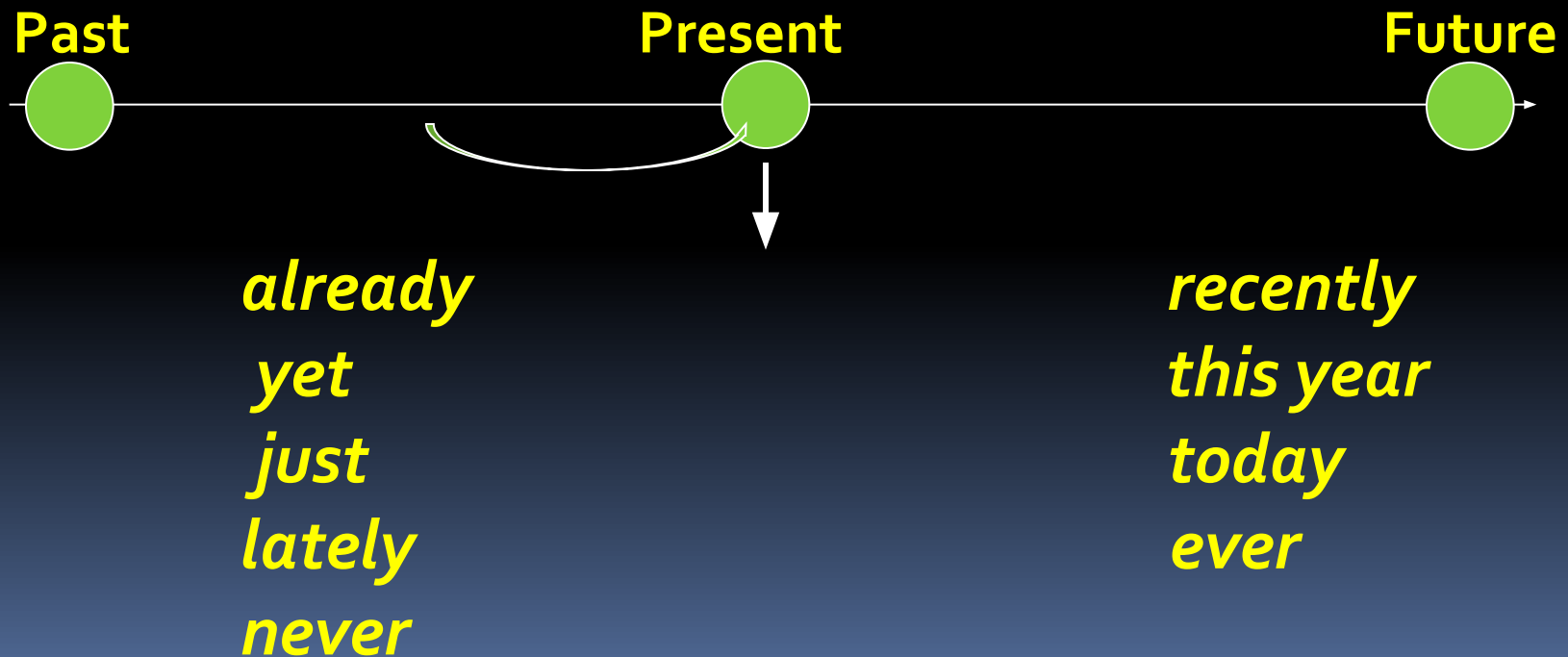
Present Perfect Tense

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Present Perfect Tense

- когда действие совершено только что.



Present Perfect Tense

+

to have V₃

I have sent.

You have sent.

He (she, it) has sent.

We have sent.

You have sent.

They have sent.



Present Perfect Tense

—
have not V₃

I haven't sent.

We haven't sent.

You haven't sent.

You haven't sent.

He (she, it) hasn't sent.

They haven't sent.

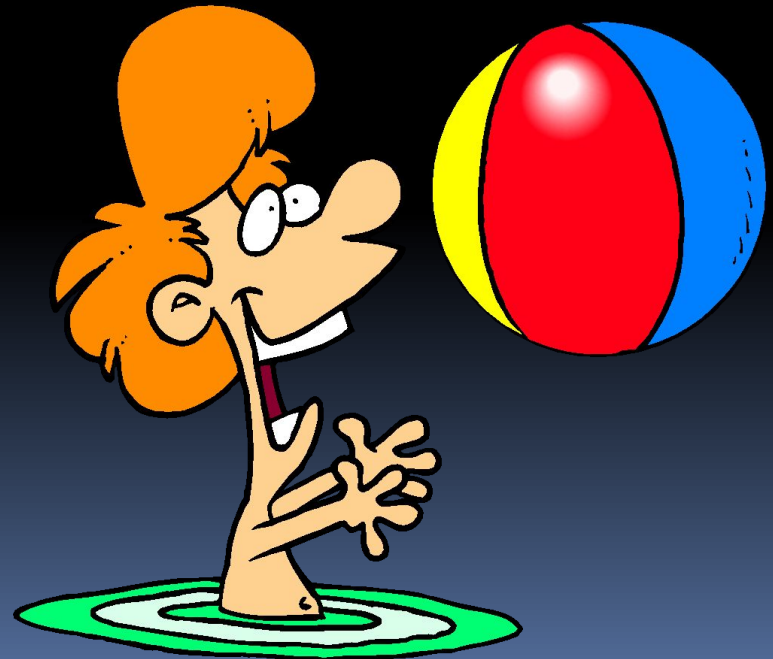

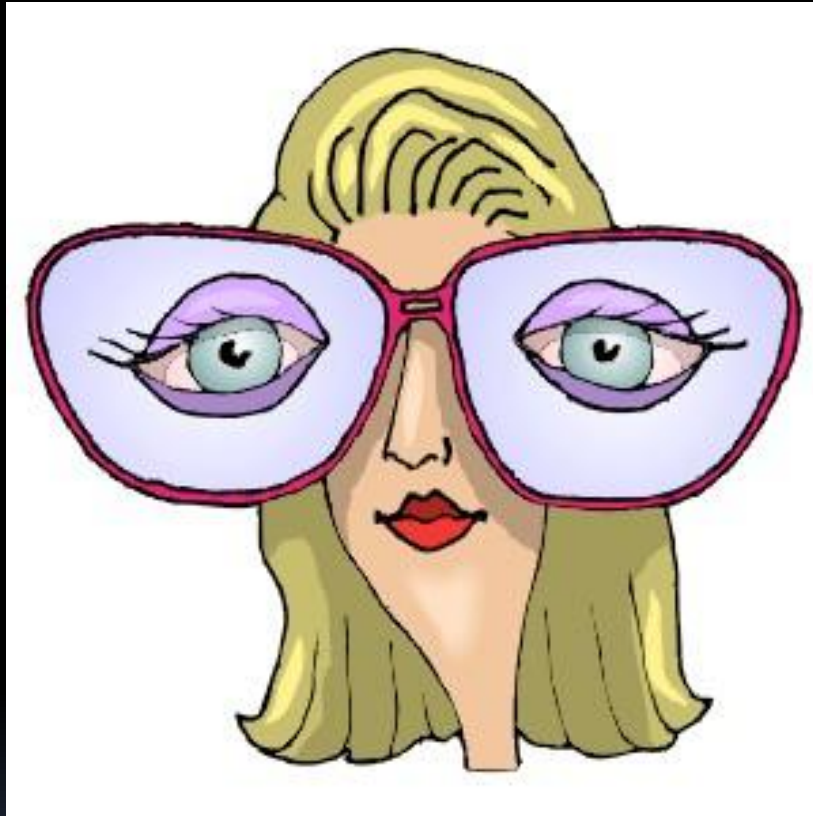

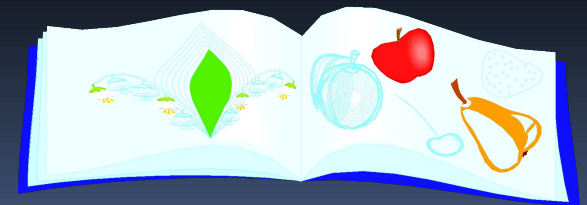
