TO DESCRIBE APPEARANCE



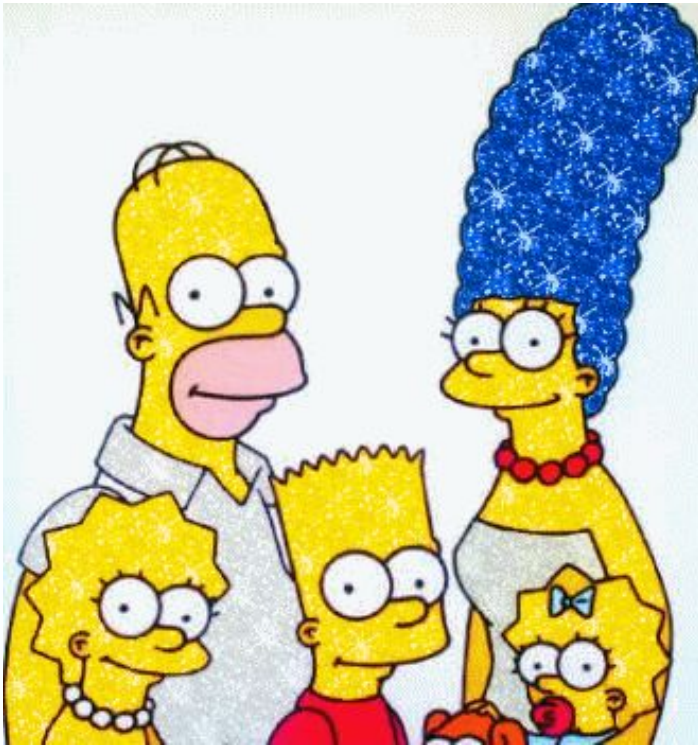
Has she **got** long hair?

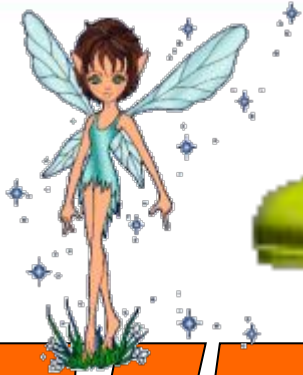
