Reported Speech

in statements

You want to tell somebody else what Tom said.



You can repeat Tom's words (direct speech):

Tom said 'I'm feeling ill.'
Or you can use *reported* speech:

Tom said that he was feeling ill.

When we use reported speech

and the main verb of the sentence is present (Tom <u>says</u> that...)

The rest of the sentence is usually present too:

Tom <u>says</u> that he <u>is feeling</u> ill.

When we use reported speech

and the main verb of the sentence is past (Tom <u>said</u> that...).

The rest of the sentence is usually past too:

Tom <u>said</u> that he <u>was feeling</u> ill.

In general, the <u>Present</u> form in <u>direct speech</u> changes to the <u>Past</u> form in <u>reported speech</u>:

```
am/is -> was
are -> were
do/does -> did
have/has ->had
shall -> should
will -> would
can -> could
may -> might
must -> had to
```

Present Simple I *phone* my friends every day." **Present Continuous**

I'm waiting for Kate.

Past Simple I made it yesterday.

Future Simple

I will study better. **Present Perfect** I've been to France three times.

Past Perfect He said (that) he made it yesterday. **Future-in-the-Past**

He said (that) he **would study** better. **Past Perfect** He said (that) he **had been** to France

three times.

Past Simple

She told him (that) she *phoned* her



He said (that) he was waiting for

tonight -> that night
yesterday -> the day before
tomorrow -> the next day
(a week)ago -> (a week) before
last year -> the year before
next year -> the following year
now -> then
here -> there
this -> that
these -> those
```
