

Goths — representatives of youth subculture that originated in the 20th century on the wave of post-punk. The Gothic subculture is quite diverse and heterogeneous, but it is characterized by common features: specific dark image, the interest in Gothic music, horror literature and films, decadence and mysticism.



Some Goths prefer clothes, stylized fashion 8-9 centuries with the appropriate attributes: lace, long gloves and long dresses in women, tail coats and cylinders in men. There are also common attributes with the fashion of Metalworkers-the frequent use of leather clothing, chains and metal accessories. Sometimes used collars and bracelets with spikes. The style of "vamp" was especially typical for ready. Gothic fashion was formed mainly from imitation of popular music

performers.





Makeup is used by both men and women. It is not an everyday attribute, and is usually applied before attending concerts and Gothic clubs. Make-up usually consists of two elements: white powder for the face and dark eyeliner around the eyes.



Attributes used by the Goths are ankh, crosses, images of bats and death symbols.





Most of Goths adore the very atmosphere of serenity and peace of cemeteries, directly related to the image of death. Goths like to spend time in cemeteries, walk there.
