London Is The Capital of the UK

London Eye

- The London Eye or Millennium Wheel, is a giant wheel situated on the banks of the River Thames in London, England.
- The entire structure is 135 m tall and the wheel has a diameter of 120 m. It is the most popular paid tourist attraction in the United Kingdom, visited by over 3.5 million people annually.



London Eye

- It is the tallest Ferris wheel in Europe, and the most popular paid tourist attraction in the United Kingdom.
- Each of the 10-tonne capsules represents one of the London Boroughs , and holds up to 25 people, who are free to walk around inside the capsule, though seating is provided. The wheel rotates at 26 cm per second so that one revolution takes about 30 minutes.
