Short answers:

Yes, I can.

❖ There is no –s in the third person singular..

She can swim very well. (**NOT** she ~~can~~s...)

❖ Questions and negatives without do.

Can you swim? (**NOT** ~~Do~~ you can swim?)

❖ After can, we use verbs without to.

I can speak Spanish. (**NOT** I can ~~to~~ speak...)

0 I ~~can~~ play soccer, but not baseball.

0 ~~Can~~ I park my car here?

0 You ~~can't~~ park your car here. It's no parking.

0 I ~~can't~~ go out tonight. I'm busy.

0 I ~~can~~ speak English, but not Spanish.

0 Where is Tom? I ~~can't~~ see him.

0 ~~Can~~ you ride bikes?
