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The Affirmative Form

Утвердительная форма



	Present Indefinite	Past Indefinite	Future Indefinite
I	have	had	shall/will have
you	have	had	will have
he, she, it	has	had	will have
we	have	had	shall/will have
they	have	had	will have

The Negative Form

Отрицательная форма



	Present Indefinite	Past Indefinite	Future Indefinite
I	have not	did not have had not	shall/will not have
you	have not	did not have had not	will not have
he, she, it	has not	did not have had not	will not have
we	have not	did not have had not	shall/will not have
they	have not	did not have had not	will not have

The Interrogative Form

Вопросительная форма



Present Indefinite	Past Indefinite	Future Indefinite
Do I have? Have I?	Did I have? Had I?	Shall/Will I have?
Do you have? Have you?	Did you have? Had you?	Will you have?
Does he (she, it) have? Has he (she, it)?	Did he have? Had he (she, it)?	Will he (she, it) have?
Do we have? Have we?	Did we have? Had we?	Shall/Will we have?
Do they have? Have they?	Did they have? Had they?	Will they have?

Contractions



The Negative Form

have not — haven't

has not — hasn't

had not — hadn't

will not — won't be

shall not — shan't

The Auxiliary Verb

Вспомогательный глагол



English	Russian
I <u>have</u> seen the new film.	Я видел новый фильм.
I <u>had</u> finished my work by five o'clock.	Я окончил свою работу к пяти часам.
I shall have translated the article by ten o'clock.	Я уже переведу статью к десяти часам.

The Main Verb

Смысловой глагол



English	Russian
I <u>have</u> a good watch.	У меня есть хорошие часы.
He <u>had</u> a large library.	У него была большая библиотека.
He <u>hasn't</u> any books on this subject.	У него нет книг по этому вопросу.

To have + Noun



English	Russian
Did you have a good rest last summer?	Хорошо ли вы отдохнули прошлым летом?
When do you have dinner?	Когда вы обедаете?
We didn't have supper at home yesterday.	Мы вчера не ужинали дома.

To have + Infinitive



English	Russian
I have to get up early on Mondays.	Я должен(мне приходится) вставать рано по понедельникам
Do you have to write this exercise?	Вы должны написать это упражнение?
They didn't have to go there.	Им не нужно было идти туда.

To have + Noun (or Pronoun) + Infinitive



English	Russian
I have something to tell you.	Я хочу вам что-то рассказать.
I have a new book to show you.	Я хочу показать вам новую книгу.
Have you anything to tell me?	
I haven't anything to tell you.
