Structure for a Problem Solution Essay

Introduction

- · Paraphrase the question.
- · Thesis Statement.

(Outline briefly the 2 problems and 2 possible solutions, keep introduction under 60 words)

Main Body 1

- · State the 1st problem
- · Give specific example and detail
- · State the solution to this problem
- · The result of the solution

Main Body 2

- · State the 2nd problem
- · Give specific example and detail
- · State the solution to this problem
- · The result of the solution

Conclusion

- · Summary of the 2 problems
- · Summary of the 2 solutions
- Recommendation / Prediction (conclusion should be about 3 - 4 sentences only, keep it concise)

Brainstorm before writing!

Getting ideas quickly by asking yourself lots of questions.

"....What are the cause of obesity? lack of exercise. Why? people don't have time to exercise. Explain? because they are busy. Why? because they have to work to earn money. What's the solution? do more exercise. How? employers could offer incentives, company gyms, find time to get to the gym.....What about junk food? Need educational campaigns about trans fats, government needs to regulate this kind of food.. yes well unhealthy food is cheaper.. so consult with local Farmers to offer fresh produce at discount prices, but what can be done about overeating?... well I think....."

Introduction

Remember: I only need to outline just 2 reasons for the problem, it is not necessary to go into detail in the introduction, I did not include any special hooks or tricks or impressive language, it is not needed and could lose you a band score if you do that. Keep it simple.

Here is the introduction in full.

"Nations worldwide are dealing with the increasing issue of obesity. This is a cause for concern for all age groups. There are two main reasons for this, over consumption of fast food and lack of exercise. This essay would like to outline more detail about this problem and suggest some possible ways to solve the issue." (55 words)

<u>The last outline sentence is optional</u>, there is nothing in the marking criteria for it but it is good for the examiner to see what you are going to write about. Remember: **Keep the introduction to under 60 words or it will be too long** and you could lose points.

Did you notice the Thesis statement does not contain an opinion? ... The original question did not ask for my opinion so I did not include it in the thesis statement.

Body paragraph 1

Key:

Green = main topic sentence , **Blue** = give an explanation , **Purple**= give an example, **Orange** = give a possible solution, **Grey** = result of the possible solution

• One of the reasons that people are becoming overweight these days is that they are eating more junk food, ready meals and convenience food rather than cooking healthy meals at home. This is because many people tend to lead a busy life and after a long day at work it is easier to just buy ready meals in the supermarket or get a take away. For instance, In the UK, sales of these types of foods have risen by 48% since 1990, this is because busy people see cooking at home as time consuming. To tackle this issue the government should take steps to increase tax on high fat, high sugar or unhealthy foods. Therefore consumers would think twice about the foods they consume, which could lead to them losing weight.

Body paragraph 2

Now I will use the same technique to write the main body 2 paragraph about lack of exercise.

• Another problem that needs to be considered is lack of exercise. As a result of leading a busy life or pressures at work, many people are just too tired to go to the gym or join a sports club. For example, after a hard day at work most people prefer to just come home and sit in front of the TV. Studies show that when people have time off, they tend to relax rather than going to a gym. One possible solution is for employers to consider the health and well being of their employees and offer inhouse company gyms or special incentives, such as discounts to join a sports or fitness club. If this is implemented it would have a positive effect on peoples health and a reduction in weight gain.

Conclusion

How to write a good conclusion.

Now lets take a look at the conclusion. Here we need to summarise briefly the 2 problems and 2 solutions with a recommendation or prediction sentence.

Key:

Green = cohesive device, **Orange** = summarise the 2 problems, **Blue** = summarise the 2 solutions, **Purple**= recommendation or prediction sentence

 In conclusion, being overweight is an increasing issue because of consumption of fast food, convenience foods and not enough exercise due to work commitments.
 The government needs to look at taxing fast food and companies should set up incentives for gyms, sports or fitness clubs. Unless this issue is tackled soon, then the problem of obesity will lead to a higher mortality rate in the future.

Tips and useful language

The last sentence is optional (the recommendation prediction sentence) but this is a good idea to include if you think the essay is slightly under 250 words. The conclusion should briefly repeat the main points you were writing about in the main bodies of the essay. Be sure to keep the conclusion short and simple, about 4 sentences is enough. You must write a conclusion, If you don not write a conclusion you will lose points. **Remember:** try to paraphrase your introduction in the conclusion, this will impress the examiner...

Examples of cohesive devices to conclude.

In conclusion / To sum up / To conclude . Just choose one of these in the conclusion. Some words that should not be used to conclude are : All in all, Finally, Lastly, in the end, In a nutshell, I reckon... don't use these they are informal or are inappropriate.

Key point on giving examples in body paragraphs:

Something that will make your band score higher is quoting percentages or recent studies when giving examples, such as "In the UK sales of these types of food have risen by 48% since 1990" or "studies show that". The data does not have to be accurate, the examiner is not going to google your information and check, the point is that you can give examples. The aim of this is to show how you can use examples to demonstrate your English language skills.

a) The people involved

- When you come to brainstorm your solutions, think of the key 'actors' who are involved. It is usually governments and individuals in some way or another.
- There may be another group specifically realted to the topic. For example, in this case it is companies and parents. If you are discussing crime it could be the police. If it is violence on TV it could be TV and film producers.
- You can then brainstorm your ideas under each 'group' and organize them in the same way.

b) Developing your solutions

- Also, try to make sure your solutions are not too simplistic. It's all too easy to make sweeping generalizations about what people can do. For example, look at this idea:
- The government should introduce stricter laws.
- It it common to see such statements in IELTS problem solution essays with no further explantion. Give more detail about how or why this would work. For example:
- Governments should ensure that adequate legislation and controls are in place that will prevent young people from accessing dangerous sites, such as requiring more than simply confirming that you are an adult to view a site.
- Some specific detail has now been given on how this solution could work.

Answer:

- In some nations, people are getting heavier and standards of health and well-being are falling. This essay will suggest that the principal cause of these issues is the type of nourishment they are eating and submit a government education program as a viable solution, followed by a reasoned conclusion.
- The main cause of the health crisis currently affecting so many individuals is over-consumption of poor quality sustenance. Convenience food and junk food, such as microwave dinners, chocolate bars, McDonald's and pizza, have become a ubiquitous part of modern life. Eating too much of these high-fat meals causes many to gain weight and this has knock-on effects on someone's general wellness. For example, the movie 'Super Size Me' demonstrated that a person who eats this kind of food all the time will not only get fat but also suffer from such things as raised blood pressure and even fatty liver disease.
