Then there was the extravagant duplication of work in examining a new book for classification and cataloging by each of a 1000 libraries instead of doing this once for all at some central point."






Standard subdivisions should be added only when the work in hand covers the whole, or approximately the whole, subject of the number in the schedules

When standard subdivision notation from Table 1 is listed in Tables 2 through 6 and in the schedules, all of the notation's notes and subdivisions as given in this table are applicable unless other instructions are given. Other Table 1 notation that is not listed in the schedules may also be used. For example, the fact that 610.7 is listed, but not 610.8 or the subdivisions of 610.7, does not exclude the use of 610.8 or 610.71

Do not add one standard subdivision to another standard subdivision unless specifically instructed. Standard subdivisions may be added to special notation listed in the regular standard subdivision sequence, to subdivisions of T1--04 Special topics that are specifically listed in the schedules, and to displaced standard subdivisions wherever they appear. Numbers in the schedules that look as though they were built with notation from this table but are outside the regular sequence of standard subdivisions are not considered "standard" subdivisions. Hence notation from Table 1 may be added to such schedule numbers



## **Development**

One of Dewey's great strengths is that the system is developed and maintained in a national bibliographic agency, the Library of Congress. The Dewey editorial office is located in the Decimal Classification Division of the Library of Congress, where classification specialists annually assign over 110,000 DDC numbers to records for works cataloged by the Library. Having the editorial office within the Decimal Classification Division enables the editors to detect trends in the literature that must be incorporated into the Classification. The editors prepare proposed schedule revisions and expansions, and forward the proposals to the Decimal Classification Editorial Policy Committee (EPC) for review and recommended action.

EPC is a ten-member international board whose main function is to advise the editors and OCLC on matters relating to changes, innovations, and the general development of the Classification. EPC represents the interests of DDC users; its members come from national, public, special, and academic libraries, and from library schools.









## **Editions**


The DDC is published in full and abridged editions in print and electronic versions. The abridged edition is a logical truncation of the notational and structural hierarchy of the corresponding full edition on which it is based, and is intended for general collections of 20,000 titles or less. WebDewey and Abridged WebDewey, the electronic versions of the full and abridged editions, respectively, are updated frequently and contain additional index entries and mapped vocabulary. The electronic versions and supplemental web postings are the chief sources of ongoing updates to the DDC. On the Dewey web site (www.oclc.org/dewey), selected new numbers and changes to the DDC are posted monthly, and mappings between selected new Library of Congress Subject Headings (LCSH) and Dewey numbers are posted biweekly.



#### Papal resignation, papal election

When <u>Pope Benedict XVI announced his intention to resign</u> as of February 28, the whole world took notice. We took notice, too. No sooner had we learned the news than questions were going the rounds of the team:

- · What would we need to do to prepare for a new pope?
- Is it really possible to distinguish cleanly between 262.1309 History of papacy and 282.0922 Collective biography of popes?
- · What would be the number for the upcoming conclave?

So that you'll be in the know before you even need to know, let's address those questions.

First, does a new pope get a new number the same way a new president (often) gets a new number? No, the DDC does not develop the history of the papacy by ecclesiastical administrations the way that it develops the history of countries by political administrations. Instead, the history of the papacy in the 2010s would be classed, in the standard way, in 262.13090512 Roman Catholic papacy, 2010–2019 (built from 262.13 Papacy and patriarchate, plus T1–090512 2010–2019). (Note the standard-subdivisions note at 262.13: "Standard subdivisions are added for . . . Roman Catholic papacy alone.")

So, is it really possible to distinguish cleanly between 262.1309 History of papacy and 282.0922 Collective biography of popes? Can you talk about the history of the papacy without discussing the lives of individual popes? Can you talk about the collective lives of popes without talking about the history of the papacy? Maybe not, but still we can make a case for when one number is more appropriate than the other. If the emphasis of the work is ecclesiological, as in <u>The chair of Saint Peter: a history of the papacy</u>, 262.1309 History of papacy is more appropriate. If the emphasis of the work is biographical, as in <u>Their name is Pius: portraits of five great modern popes</u>, 282.0922 Collective biography of popes is more appropriate.

What about the process whereby a new pope is elected? What's the number for a papal conclave? The LCSH <u>Popes—Election</u> includes 450 fields for Conclaves—Papal and Papal conclaves, so we might assume that those two questions are driving at the same thing. But perhaps it is again a matter of emphasis. If the emphasis is on the overall process, as in <u>Papal elections in the age of transition, 1878-1922</u>, or on the newly elected pope, as in <u>The making of the Pope: the selection of Pope Benedict XVI and what this choice means for Catholics today, 262.13 Papacy and patriarchate, is more appropriate. But if the emphasis is specifically on the actions of the College of Cardinals, as in <u>Les faiseurs de papes: les cardinaux et le conclave</u> [The makers of popes: the cardinals and the conclave], then <u>262.135</u> College of Cardinals is more appropriate. (Standard subdivisions can be added in either case.)</u>




