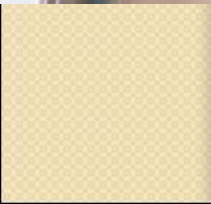

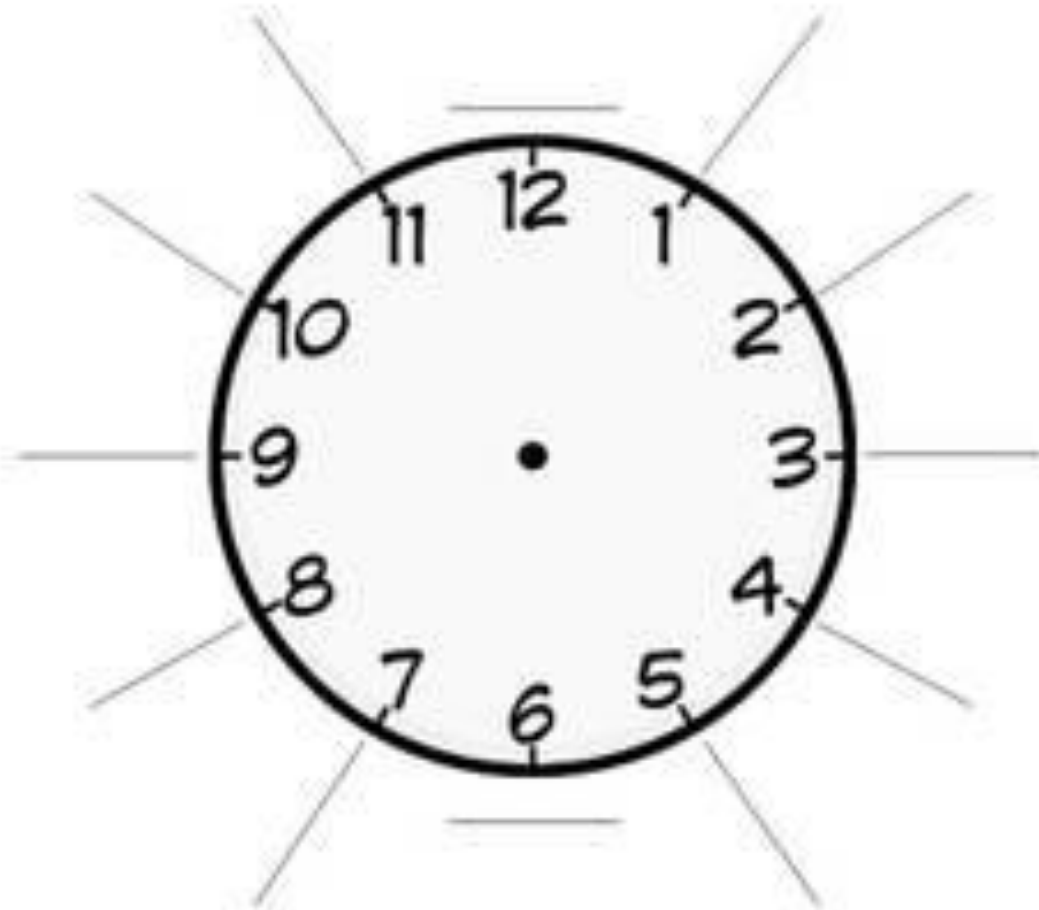




# Dialogue
