

Future Simple

promises

I promise I'll help

to tidy your house.

is used for...

predictions for the future (hope, think, believe, expect, imagine, I'm sure, I'm afraid)

I think she'll change her mind.



Tomorrow, the day after tomorrow, next week/ month/year, tonight, soon, in a week/month/year, etc.



on-the-spot decisions

Future Continuous

is used for...

actions which will be in progress at a stated future time

This time next week I'll be sunbathing in Barbados.



actions which will definitely happen in the future as a result of a routine or arrangement

She will be driving to Cheshire tonight.



when we ask politely about someone's plans for the near future

Will you be watching the show tonight?





Future Perfect

is used for...

An action which will be finished before a stated future time.

She will have written her essay by 7 o'clock. Before, by, by then, be the time, until/till (By the time she gets home, she will have driven for four hours.)



Future Perfect Continuous

is used for ...

duration of an action up to a certain time in the future

By the end of this year she will have been working here for two years.

By the next year he will have been working here for two years.





is used for...

things already decided in the near future

He **is going to fly** to Rome tomorrow.



He likes acting. He **is going to be** an actor.

intention



when there is evidence that sth will definitely happen

Watch out! You'**re going to** fall over.



when we talk about things we are sure about

We **are going to** build a bridge here. (It has been decided)



Present Simple VS Present Continuous

is used for...

permanent situations

He works in an office.

<u>repeated</u> actions in the present, especially with adverbs of frequency

He often **buys** her flowers.



<u>timetables</u> or <u>programmes</u>


The lesson **starts** at 10 o'clock.

<u>facts</u> which are permanently true

The sun **sets** in the west.



Present Simple VS Present Continuous



is used for...

fixed arrangements in the near future

I'**m flying** to London <u>tomorrow</u>.








How long are you staying in London?
