- A. In the United States, Christmas is widely celebrated as a festive and family-oriented holiday. Many families decorate their homes with lights, ornaments, and Christmas trees. The day is marked by the exchange of gifts, and traditional meals like roast turkey or ham are often enjoyed. Santa Claus is a central figure, and children eagerly await his arrival on Christmas Eve. Many communities also organize carolling, and festive events to spread the holiday cheer.
- B. In Japan, Christmas is not a national holiday, and it is not associated with religious traditions as much as in Western countries. Instead, Christmas is often considered a time for romantic outlings and special dinners. It's common for couples to exchange gifts, and Christmas Eve is often seen as a romantic occasion. Fried chicken from KFC has become a popular Christmas meal, thanks to a successful marketing campaign in the 1970s, and Christmas cake is a common dessert.
- C. In Mexico, Christmas festivities begin on December 16th with the start of the Posadas, a series of processions reenacting Mary and Joseph's search for a place to stay in Bethlehem. The celebrations continue until Christmas Eve, known as Noche Buena. Families come together for a feast that includes traditional foods like tamales and bacalao (salted codfish). Midnight Mass is attended, and fireworks light up the sky. The holiday season extends until January 6th with the celebration of Epiphany, known as Día de Reyes, when children receive gifts.
- D. In Sweden, the Christmas season is characterized by the celebration of St. Lucia's Day on December 13th. The eldest daughters in the family dress as Lucia, wearing a crown of candles, and lead a street procession singing traditional songs. Christmas Eve is the main day of celebration when families gather for a festive meal featuring dishes like herring, ham, and meatballs. The Christmas tree is adorned with candles and ornaments, and the exchange of gifts takes place after the evening meal.
- E. In India, where various religions coexist, Christmas is celebrated with diversity. In cities like Mumbai and Delhi, streets are often adorned with lights and decorations. Midnight Mass is attended by many Christians, and festive markets attract people from all backgrounds. In some regions, like Goa, traditional Indian sweets are exchanged along with Christmas treats. 
