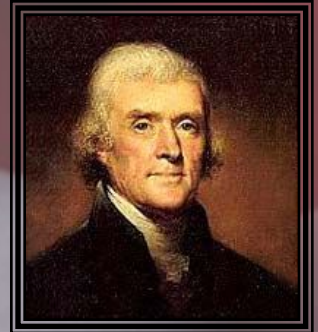
The Presidents of the USA

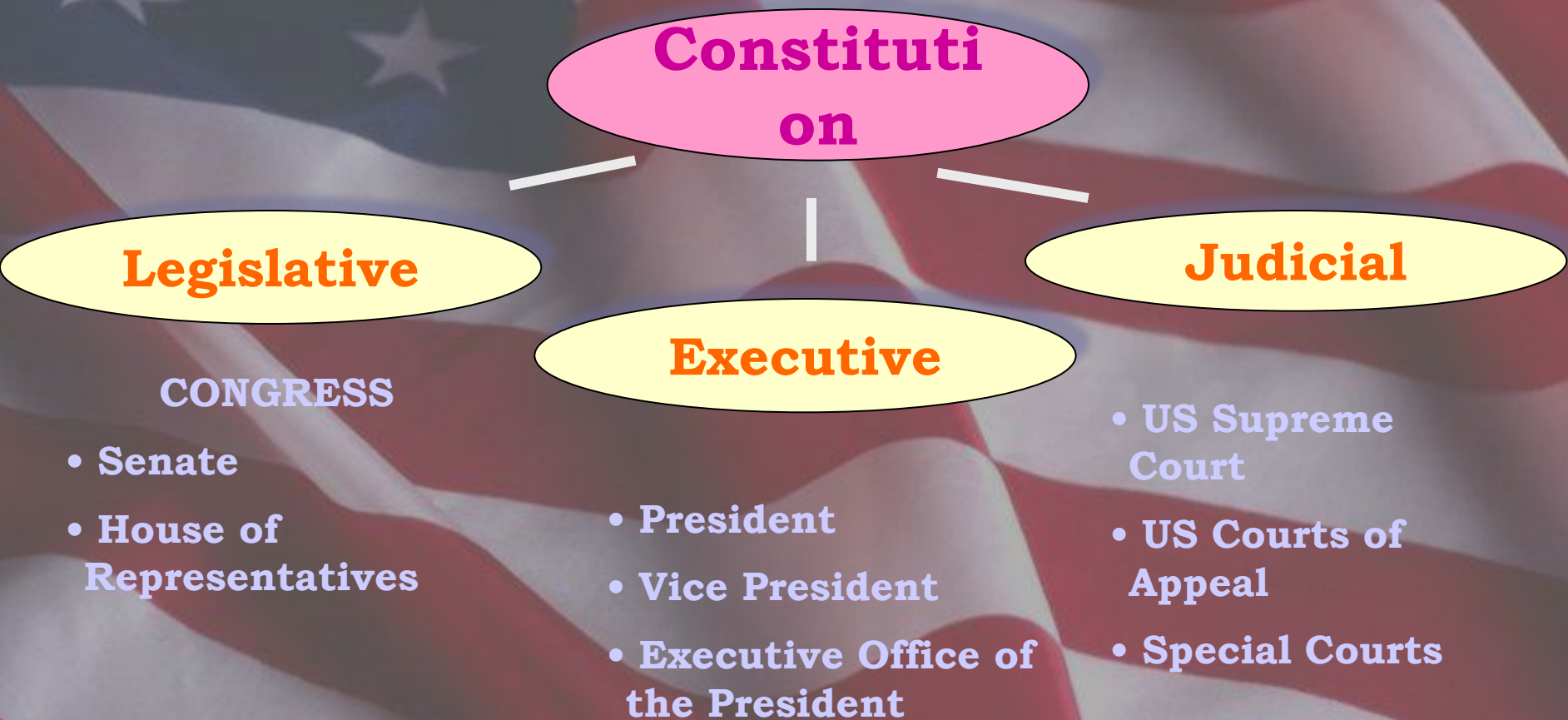

The legislative branch

1. The Congress.

2. It is a group of people elected to make laws for the country.

3. Congress has two parts: The Senate and The House of Representatives.





The senate

- 1. There are 100 senators.*
- 2. Each state has two senators.*
- 3. A Senator is in office for 6 years. This is called a "term."*
- 4. Senators meet in the U.S. Capitol building*

The house of representatives

- 1. There are 435 representatives.*
- 2. The more people that live in a state, the more representatives it has.*
- 3. Representatives serve for a term of two years.*
- 4. They can be elected for more than one term.*

The Executive Branch

- 1. The president, or Chief Executive, is the head of the government.*
- 2. Americans vote every four years for their leader of their democratic society.*
- 3. After elected to serve his/her country, the president lives and works in the White House.*
- 4. The president is in charge of the armed forces.*
- 5. The president works with leaders of other countries.*

The Judicial branch

- 1. The Supreme Court is the highest court in the U. S., and is the system of courts to settle questions about the laws.*
- 2. The nine justices can serve for as long as they live, or wish to retire.*
- 3. Each justice is chosen by the president.*
