


George Bush



appointed by the President for life

Courts of Appeals (13)

- Federal Circuit

appointed by the President for life

District Courts (94)

(from 1 to 4 in each state the number depends on the size of the state)

appointed by the President for life

Courts of Special Jurisdiction (5)

- Court of Appeals for the Armed Forces
- Court of Appeals for Veterans Claims
- Court of Federal Claims

- Court of International Trade
- Tax Court

appointed by the President for life

The legislative branch

- 1. The Congress.
- 2. It is a group of people elected to make laws for the country.

 The Senate
 - and The House of Representatives.

The senate

- 1. There are 100 senators.
- 2. Each state has two senators.
- 3.A Senator is in office for 6 years. This is called a "term."
- 4. Senators meet in the U.S. Capitol building

The house of representatives

- 1. There are 435 representatives.
- 2. The more people that live in a state, the more representatives it has.
- 3. Representatives serve for a term of two years.
- 4.They can be elected for more than one term.

The Executive Branch

- 1.The president, or Chief Executive, is the head of the government.
- 2.Americans vote every four years for their leader of their democratic society.
- 3. After elected to serve his/her country, the president lives and works in the White House.
- 4. The president is in charge of the armed forces.
- 5. The president works with leaders of other countries.

The Judicial branch

- 1. The Rupieme Court is the highest court is the V. S., and is the system of courts to settle questions about the laws.
- 2. The nine justices can serve for as long as they live or with to retire.
- 3. Each justice is chosen by the president.

Government

-The president carries out the laws of the United States.

-The Congress (Senate and House of Representatives) makes the laws.

-The Supreme Court explains the laws.
