

Bonfire night - Guy fawkes


On the evening of 5th november, there are fireworks, bonfires and people burn guy fawk's images as they celebrate his failure to blow up the parliament in 1605

Easter in Britain has its beginnings long before the arrival of Christianity.




HALLOWEEN

Orange and black are Halloween colors because orange is associated with the Fall harvest and black is associated with darkness and death.





