• homas Gainsborough (14 May 1727, died 2 August 1788) was an English portrait and landscape painter, draughtsman, and printmaker. He surpassed his rival <u>Sir Joshua Reynolds</u> to become the dominant British <u>portraitist</u> of the second half of the 18th century. He preferred landscapes to portraits, and is credited (with <u>Richard Wilson</u>) as the originator of the 18th-century British landscape school.

Margaret Burr

• In 1746, Gainsborough married Margaret Burr, an illegitimate daughter of the <u>Duke of Beaufort</u>, who settled a £200 annuity on them.



In 1759, Gainsborough and his family moved to <u>Bath</u>, living at number 17 <u>The Circus</u>. There, he studied portraits by <u>van Dyck</u>.
