There are postmodernism, conceptualism, intellectual literature, magic realism, the cyberpunk, a fantasy and numerous book series. Here graphic novels (comics), an electronic epistolary genre, and new forms of folklore in the form of songs, jokes, sketches, linguistic experiments belong.

Literature at the present stage is exposed to serious structural changes. It adapts to a new rhythm of life, to new reader's perception of reality. It becomes more versatile. Before considering the fashionable modern directions in literature, we will stop on classical genres, and will look as they adapt for requirements of time.

It is interesting to observe how modern literature of 21 centuries continues to develop the detective story. It became truly many-sided. Besides detectives become historical, ironical, fantastic, intellectual. To take, for example, Dan Brown, Boris Akunin, Humberto Eco's works

Further modern literature of 21 centuries develops a fantasy. But it's are under different points of view and strongly branch. Fantasy literature at the present stage cooperates with the computer game industry. They are Based on the most known computer games books, and vice versa. city fantasy, cyberpunk, post-apocalypse, science fantasy, horror and Gothic novel.

The realism continues to take a sure position. But it also branched, and the modern directions in literature strongly are developed by his brothers: surrealism, critical realism, metaphorical realism, magic realism. The foundation laid by Borges, Márquez and Cortázar continues to develop new generations of writers, such as Elfriede Jelinek, Goran Petrovich, Mario Vargos Llosa and others.

The 2000s (decade) saw a steep increase in the acceptability of literature of all types, inspired by the coming-of-age of millions of people who enjoyed the works of writers such as C. S. Lewis and J. R. R. Tolkien in their youths.

■ The 2000s (decade) also saw the popularization of manga, or Japanese comics, among international audiences, particularly in **English-speaking nations.**


